Retinopathy of prematurity (ROP) is an eye problem which can occur in babies who were born too early (premature babies). It particularly affects babies who were born before the 32nd week of pregnancy, or who weighed less than 1500 g at birth. The earlier the baby is born, the higher the risk.

Retinopathy of Prematurity | Patient

Retinopathy of prematurity (ROP) is a potentially blinding eye disorder that primarily affects premature infants weighing about 2¾ pounds (1250 grams) or less that are born before 31 weeks of gestation (a full-term pregnancy has a gestation of 38–42 weeks). The smaller a baby is at birth, the more likely that baby is to develop ROP.

Abnormal blood vessels may grow out of the retina and cause scar tissue to form, leading to detachment of the retina which can cause blindness. This damage is known as retinopathy of prematurity and if not monitored or treated at the correct time, can cause vision loss.

Retinopathy of prematurity can be viewed as an arrest of normal retinal neuronal and vascular development in the preterm infant, with ultimately pathological compensatory mechanisms that result in aberrant vascularisation of the retina.

Retinopathy of prematurity, also called retrolental fibroplasia and Terry syndrome, is a disease of the eye affecting prematurely born babies generally having received neonatal intensive care, in which oxygen therapy is used due to the premature development of their lungs. It is thought to be caused by disorganized growth of retinal blood vessels which may result in scarring and retinal detachment. ROP can be mild and may resolve spontaneously, but it may lead to blindness in serious cases. Thus
